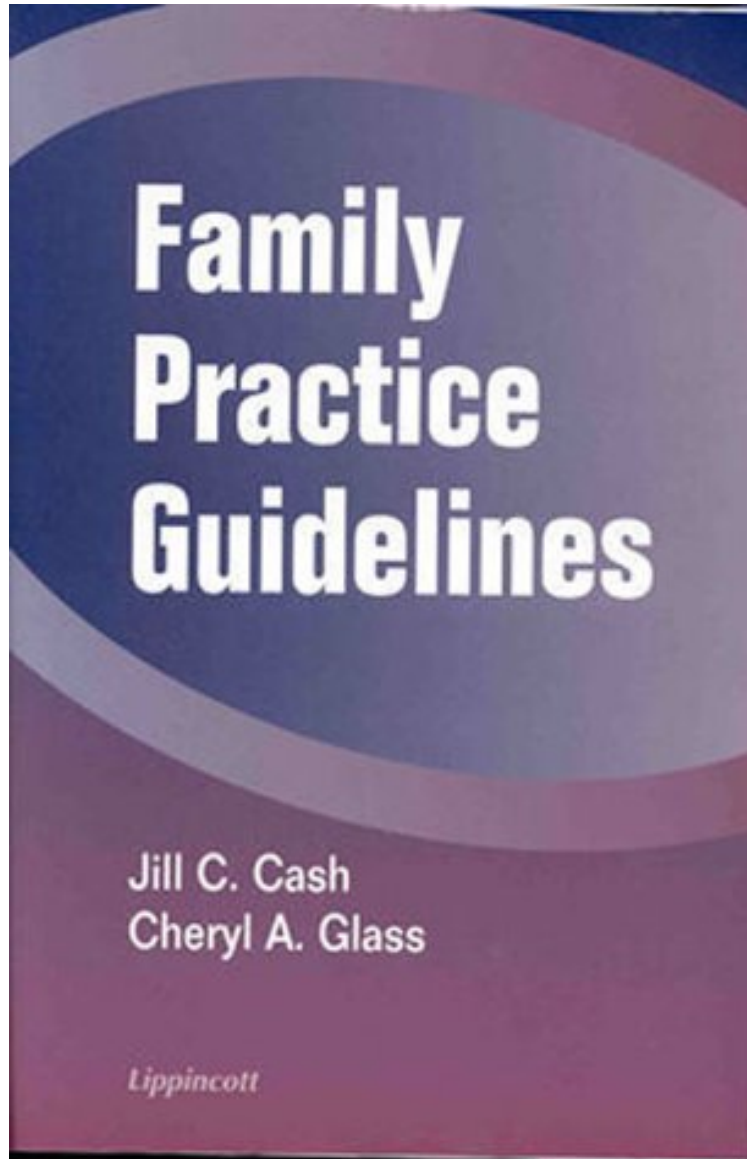

However the binding is too flimsy for the weight of the book and was torn upon delivery. I returned the book. The guidelines are too basic for practical use for an experienced practitioner.
