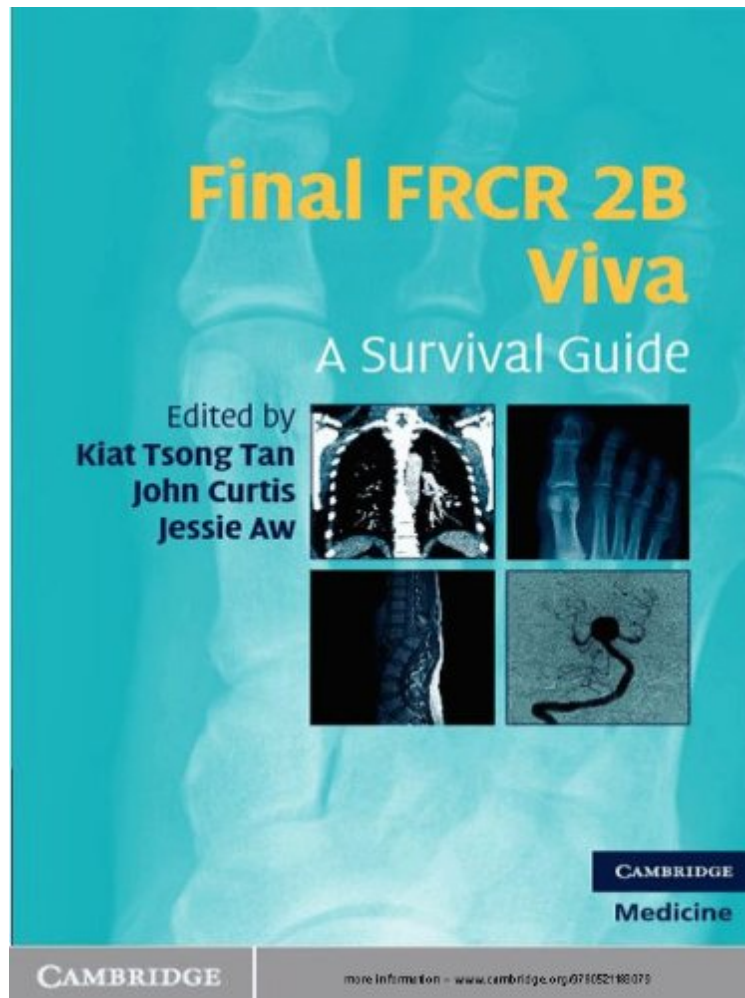

It covers all the sections with classic cases, and slightly atypical cases that are still fair game for the US oral boards. It is a typical case format text with images, presentation, and then concise anatomic descriptions, aunt minnie features, and most importantly, management issues that most of my fellow residents have the toughest time with. There are a few follow up questions per case which emphasize these points. There is no superfluous information. I could easily imagine reciting the sample responses in Louisville.
