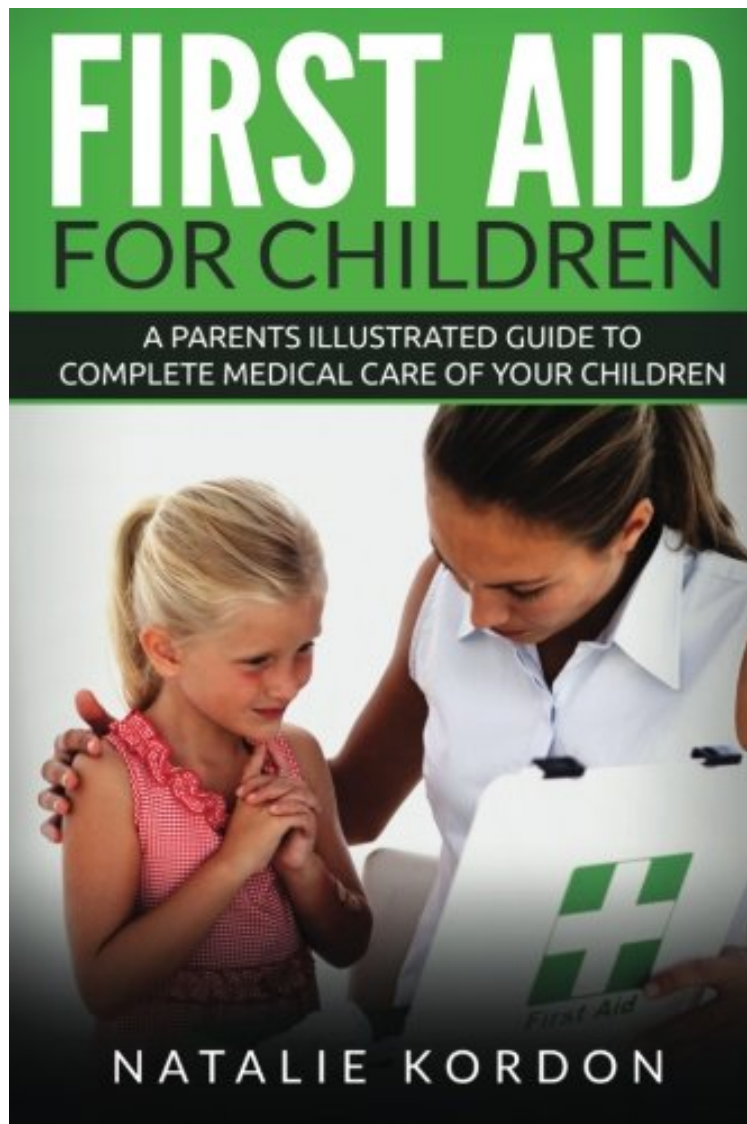

inaccurate) vanity press fodder. By bibliomom Well, this is what I get for ordering late at night. To quote the author blurb from the back of the book: "I am a motivational, health nutrition enthusiast, that is passionate about studying the habits in life and fitness to be able to share my knowledge and experiences with others." I'm not sure what a "motivational" is, but it doesn't seem to qualify her to write a first aid book. The entire book reads like a 6th grade report on first aid, including the poor grammar, choppy sentence structure, awkward formatting, and gigantic font one would expect from a middle schooler. Her information is equally unclear and undeveloped: "Fever is a high temperature in which the body temperature goes above 37 C (98.6 F). It is caused by a sore throat, infection, chickenpox, and earache. It is common in children and should be treated immediately because the temperature above 39 C (102.2 F) can be dangerous for a child." First, average body temperature is 98.6 F; merely surpassing this number does not constitute a "high temperature" or constitute an emergency. Second, sore throats and earaches don't cause fever. They're all symptoms of underlying illnesses such as viral or bacterial infections. Skipping over the bizarre recommendations for antibiotic use and the total lack of explanation as to why to avoid aspirin, she lists this gem under "Treatment for Cold and Flu" "There is no need to head straight to a drug store because there are some home remedies that are really useful: - Watery mucus coming out of the nose- Feeling tired- Sneezing- Fever- Cough- Sore throat I've never treated a fever with "Watery mucus coming out of the nose" and wouldn't advise it, but it gives you a good idea what a complete and utter hot mess this is. At best, it's merely poorly researched, poorly written, and largely unedited. At worst it's actually dangerous, claiming that, "Sometimes, the children are not able to bear ice pack. You can use a thin plastic bag..." A great recommendation if you want to simultaneously give your child ice burns while exposing them to a suffocation hazard. Not all of the information is outright dangerous and wrong, but way too much of it is. Is it an honest self-publishing effort gone horribly wrong? A terrible computer translation of a pamphlet blown up to a giant font to fill out a book? Was the whole thing computer generated? It is completely bizarre, start to finish, down to the equally poorly written glowing reviews. I was, in a word, suckered. The shame of it all! No more late night ordering for me. I can't even donate this piece of garbage for fear someone else would use it.
