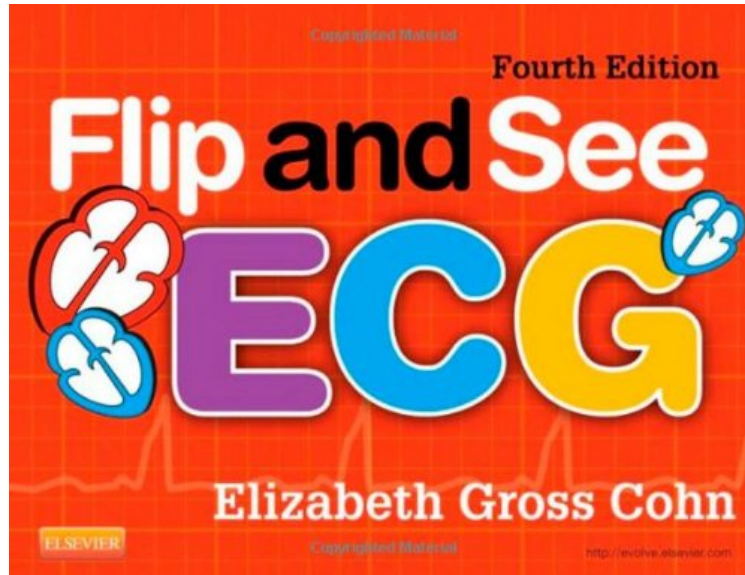

First, the Pocket Guide that comes with the book, while helpful, does not actually have the ECG ruler that the book claims it has so you can't use it to find the HR on an ECG. Second, the book's explanation of how to find the axis using the Pocket Guide is pretty good but when you have to use the aVF as your isoelectric lead it is useless as the directions then tell you to look at lead II to see whether to use the positive or negative number... the only two numbers available are a zero and a +/- 180 so which one is positive and which is negative? You are better off to do it the old fashioned way (by looking at lead I then lead aVF to determine the quadrant first). Other issues have to do with editing errors, such as insisting that Infarction= oxygen deprivation and Ischemia= death of tissue (these definitions should be reversed and in fact they are... kind of... on the Pocket Guide but they are repeatedly wrong in the book).
