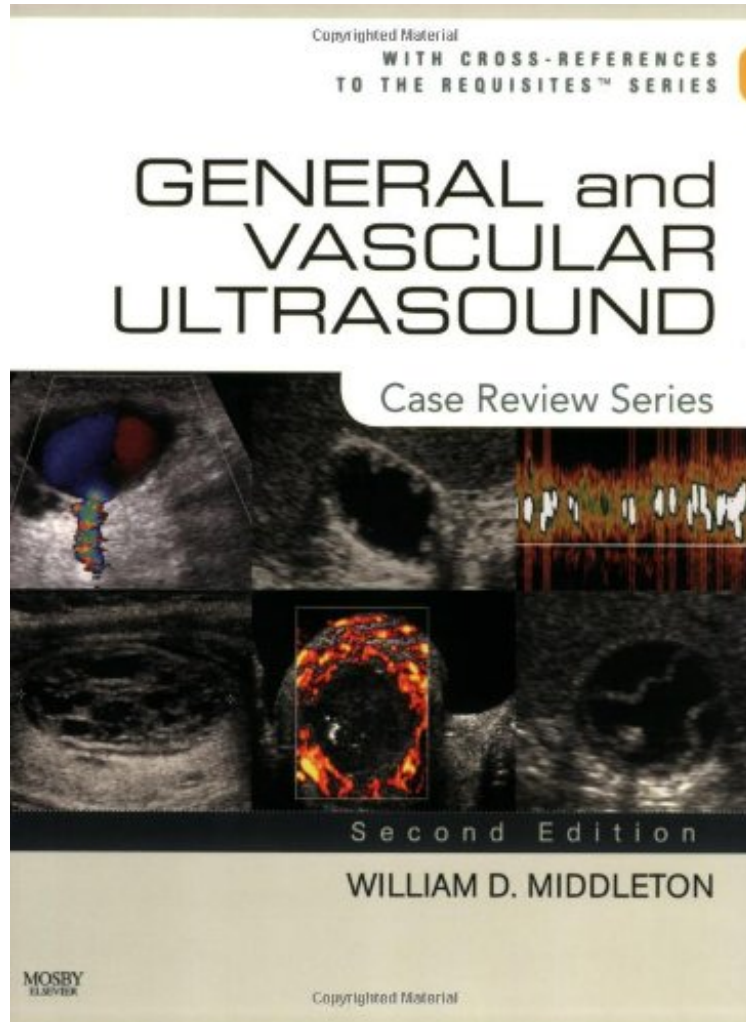

Features new images and color illustrations throughout the text. Groups cases by topic for a more efficient, targeted review of information.
