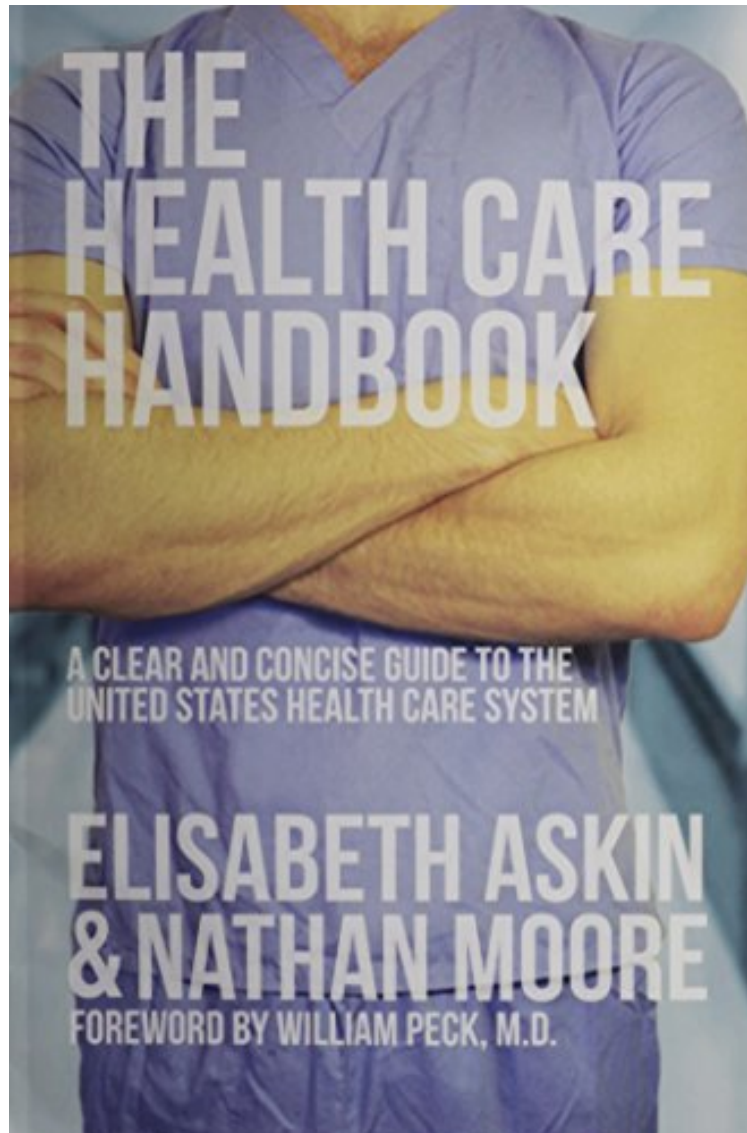

Clear, Concise Overview By T. Nelson The book makes it clear from the beginning that many of its topics would not be covered in great depth; honestly, that is likely for the best. While other books may cover the subjects in the chapters more thoroughly, few provide the breadth of knowledge found here. The authors do a nice job cultivating the most important information that a reader might want to know. Each of the five chapters covers a facet of the current healthcare system, objectively describing the pros and cons, and describes how these components will/should/could change in the coming years. With the Affordable Care Act upheld, this book is topical, and although specifics might change in the future, many of the ideas presented provide good general knowledge about the health care industry.
