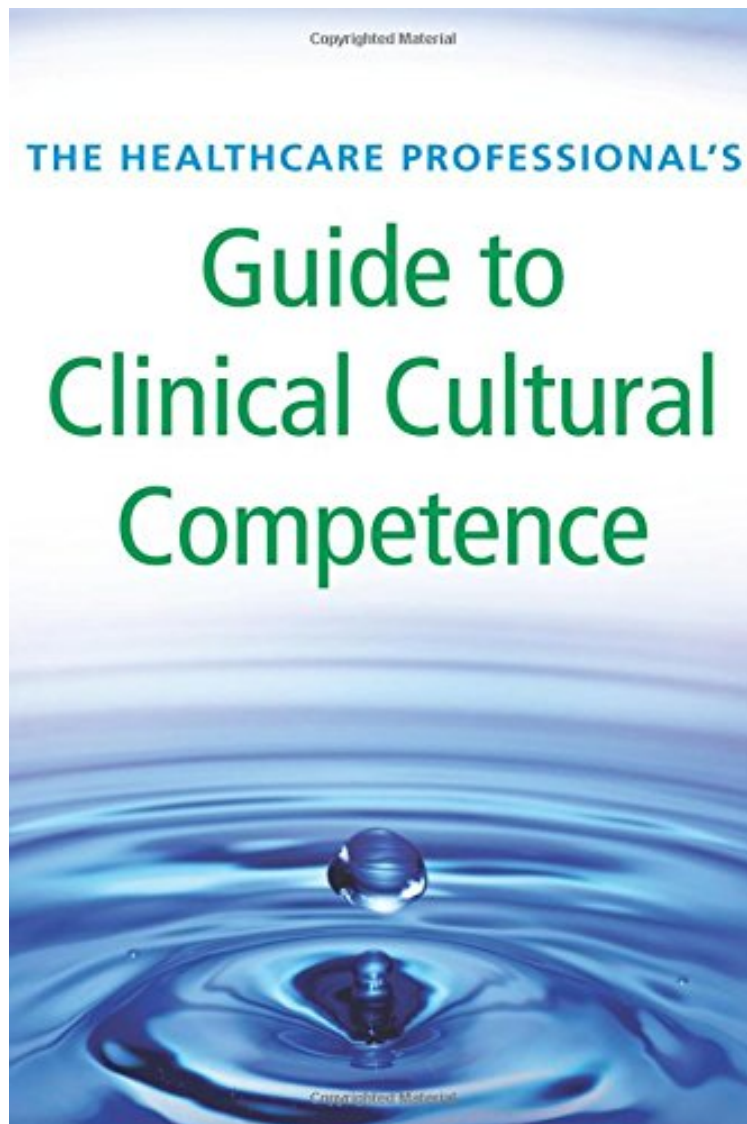

BundeAfter reviewing many texts for use in a healthcare professional's cultural competence course, I finally came across this text, which provides my students with just what they need. The topics are broader, in cultural context - dealing with different ethnicities, generations, birth, death, immigration, mental health. In the conferences I've attended on the subject, the move is to get away from the specific ethnicities (such as all Hispanics believe this, and this is how you treat them, all Japanese do this health practice, etc.) and teach our students how to better formulate individualized care for ALL patients. Most texts available have a chapter for each ethnicity or group - not very helpful for the majority of students who may rarely deal with those groups.The book is by a Canadian nurse, and the context of the book is based upon the Canadian healthcare system, but I find it 90% applicable to my U.S. (non-nursing) students, especially because of the way it addresses such universal cultural competence topics, such as communication. The chapters are pretty short (~25 pages) and the book is easy to read. It is interspersed with a variety of scenarios/case studies, making it very clinical.[...]
