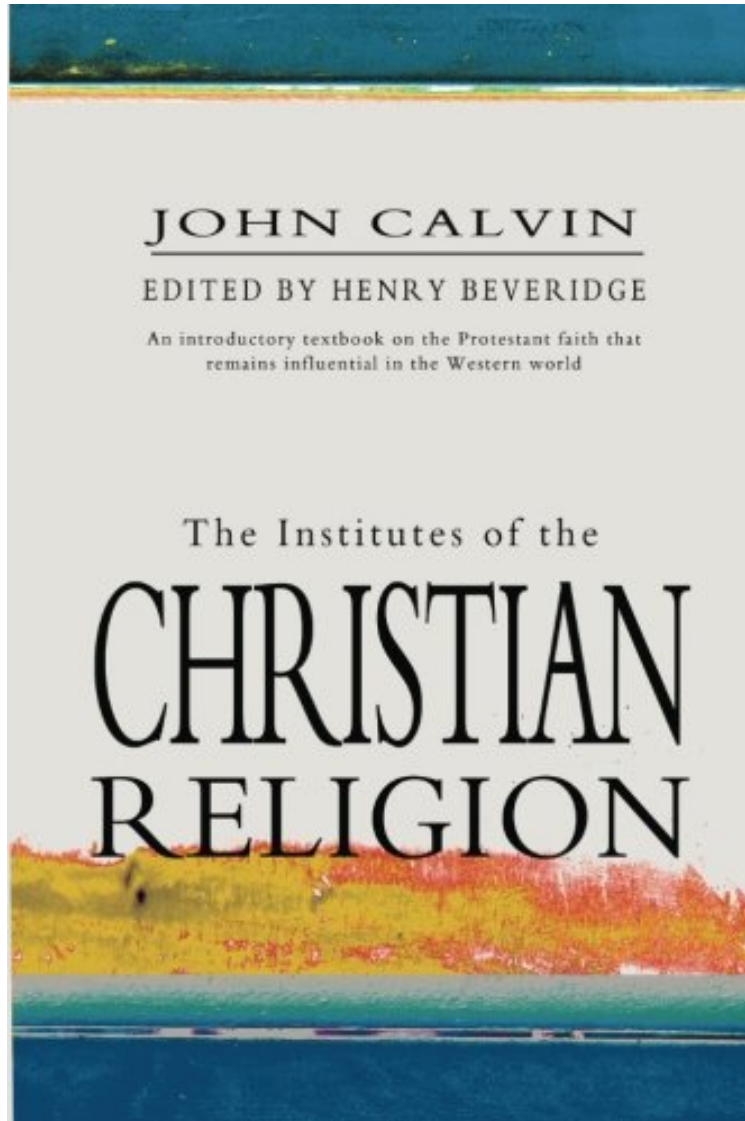

Second, the product being in one volume is somewhat intimidating. The print size being such that a senior may find it difficult to read. Third, The soft back binding is holding up very well. In Geneva he rejected the authority of the Pope, established a new scheme of civic and church governance, and created a central hub from which Reformed theology was propagated. He is renowned for his teachings and writings.
